

Planting Your Bio-cup

Bio-cups are a fun, easy and environmentally friendly way to transplant your seedlings. The Bio-cup has been created using plant materials and are designed to breakdown in the earth or compost bin. To assist this process carefully poke a series of holes, with a pen, in the bottom and sides of the cup. This will help the process begin and allow water to drain freely. Dig a hole about twice the width of your cup in the veggie garden. Bury the cup up to the top of the outer rim and cover with a layer of mulch. If you are transplanting your seedling into a larger pot it is advised that you take the seedling out of the Bio-cup all together as it will biodegrade slower in a pot. Your empty cup can go into the compost bin. If you have planted a small Christmas tree be mindful that they can grow quite large. It is advised that you transplant the tree into a larger pot to help control growth.
